Are the vaccines safe? What do we know?

YES!

- All vaccines are safe!
- All vaccines will keep you safe from getting very ill from COVID-19.
- The best vaccine for you is the first one you can get.

Why should I get the vaccine if it might make me feel bad?



- The benefit of being protected from from Covid-19 far outweighs the small discomfort you may have after the vaccine.
- You may experience minor side effects like a sore arm. These are good signs your body is building protection!
- For most, the minor side effects resolve within 48 hours.

What happens after I get the vaccine?

- The vaccine protects you, but you still need to protect others.
- We are still learning about:
 - how effective the vaccine is against variants.
 - how well vaccines keep people from spreading the disease.
 - how long vaccines can protect people.
- Until we know more: wear a mask, wash your hands, and keep 6 feet distance.





