COVID-19 Case Trends - Increase in Pediatric Cases, though Overall Case Rates Continue to Decline

The COVID-19 Delta Variant continues to be active in the Santa Cruz County community and throughout the country. The below trends show the various impacts of COVID-19 within our community.


- As of 9/7/21, data shows a -21% change in average number cases in the last 14 days, compared to 2 weeks ago when it was at +23% change in cases.
- While COVID-19 hospitalization projections estimate a slow decline in coming weeks, our local hospitals continue to be impacted due to staffing shortages and other health concerns.
- Local <u>Demographics Dashboard</u> shows an increase in the weekly COVID-19 case rate among the Latinx population.
- There is a significant increase in cases in the O-19 age group, a change from previous weeks where increases were in the 20-34 and 35-54 age groups. This also reflects trends at the state and country level.
- Per the <u>CDC COVID-19 Transmission Map</u>, our county is in the Substantial orange zone as of 9/10/2021.

Testing

Looking for COVID-19 Testing? Appointments are available at OptumServe, medical providers, and Urgent Care locations.

- Starting on Friday, 9/10/21, a mobile testing bus will be positioned at the Mountain Resource Center in Felton from 10am-6pm Fridays-Tuesdays for the foreseeable future.
- OptumServe locations, Santa Cruz Civic Center and Ramsay Park, have COVID-19 testing appointments available for adults and children, 7 days/week across both sites.
