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

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State mandated population for Behavioral Health?

Specialty Mental Health Services

1. Medi-Cal or Un-insured
2. Adults who have a Severe Mental Illness
3. Children who have a Serious Emotional Disturbance
4. High Level of functional impairment due to a mental illness resulting in an inability to provide self care

Or....

5. Crisis services to any resident of the County



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- What about adults without a diagnosis of “Severe Mental Illness”?
Integrated Behavioral Health (IBH)-County of Santa Cruz behavioral health program
- Adults, mild to moderate mental health impairments
- Patients of the county primary care clinics
- Services include therapy; support groups and psychiatric medication management




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- Total County of Santa Cruz Population estimates for 2017: **275,897**






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





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7,680 unduplicated clients served in the Behavioral Health System in 2017

2017 Served by Age Group





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



2017 Served by Client Location






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
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FY 2017-18 Expenditures



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INN purpose:

MHSOAC monitors and approves all funding for INN programs

- underserved populations
- interagency collaboration
- high quality services



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INN program- Integrated Health and Supportive Housing (IHSH)

IHSH supports Whole Person Care initiative “Cruz to Health”

IHSH program:

- community based housing
- people diagnosed with severe mental illness and a medical condition

Intervention: People receive medical support including telehealth monitoring

Goal: To provide safe, stable housing while improving health outcomes
